All Exhibitors must use on-line entry available July 1st through July 31st. Go to www.itascacountyfair.org; go to fair entry tab and then click on the online registration link, be sure to "SUBMIT" entries from the viewing screen. You may also download and preview the Exhibitor Handbook Rules and Regulations on that web page. We require advance entry for all exhibits. Advance entry allows us to have the exhibit tags and forms ready for you when you get to the fair. Please pay close attention to the entry times for each division. To enter in the 4-H department, you must contact the 4-H office.

Need assistance with registering your fair entries: Call the fair office and the volunteers will assist in computer entries.

VENDOR EXHIBITS

Exhibits must be ready to open by 3:00pm Wednesday until 8:00pm, Thursday 10:00-8:00, Friday and Saturday 10:00-9:00; Sunday 11:00am to 4:00pm Commercial exhibitors are required to retain their exhibit until 4:00pm the closing day of fair. Each vendor must be pre-approved. Vendor contact info Karl Greniger or Tammi Anderson email; icfair1336@gmail.com.

AWARDS

The superintendent of the division or some other person appointed shall assist as clerk and shall keep a record of the awards made. This record when completed shall be signed by the clerk and returned to the secretary.

The awards on entries shall be designated by ribbons or cards, as follows: First premium, blue; second, red; third, white.

All awards shall be made by comparison of the individual merits of the entries.

Any interferences by exhibitors to influence or dictate decisions of the judges will be sufficient cause for excluding his or her entry from competition, and should be reported to the secretary through the superintendent of the division.

An exhibitor may protest to the superintendent of the division at the time of the award, who may then require the judges to give reasons for such placing.

No superintendent shall award any discretionary premiums. Whenever articles of superior merit are exhibited for which no premiums have been offered, the superintendent may enter the same as "commended" in the book of awards so that the secretary may report the same to the board for future action.

Premiums will not be awarded on articles or animals of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition for a premium. The judges may award no premium, second, or first premium as merit may warrant stating the reason in writing when requested.

PAYMENT OF PREMIUMS

Premium checks will be available on Sunday after 5:00 pm. They will be distributed at their respective exhibit building by the superintendent of the building.

CHILDREN'S BARNYARD

Will be supervised by the **4-H.** If you have some animals that will make an interesting exhibit in the barnyard and would like to exhibit them contact the **4-H** office.

MEMBERSHIP IN AGRICULTURAL ASSOCIATION

The annual dues of this Society are \$20 for the year and shall include a parking pass to the Itasca County Fair. The Annual Meeting is held on the first Wednesday of November and to vote at the annual meeting, memberships must be purchased by September 30, of the current year.

We welcome members to the Itasca County Agricultural Association.

ITASCA COUNTY FAIR GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Posting signs, of any nature, is prohibited on the Fairgrounds at all times. Passing out handbills or dodgers ONLY from space rented at the Annual Fair will be permitted.
- Selling of chances, selling tickets, buttons, etc., for any event, or soliciting for any purpose on the fairgrounds must be approved in writing 60 days prior to the annual fair. All proceeds are to be returned to the Itasca County Agricultural Association for the betterment of the fairgrounds.
- 3. No horse trailer or camper shall be parked anywhere on the Fairgrounds until arrangements have been made with the Caretaker and the parking fee is paid.
- 4. To provide a well-balanced Midway during the Annual Fair, the Fair Management will book a limited number of rides, shows and concessions of various natures. Full information can be secured from the Secretary.
- Sale of obscene literature, pictures or articles is strictly forbidden.
- 6. Each owner is personally responsible for proper maintenance and operation of each concession and for business like removal from Fairgrounds after close of the Fair. All mechanical rides must be covered with liability insurance and evidence of such coverage shown to Fair Management when so requested. All electrical ground cable is to be buried at least three inches. Any show operating an after show or annex shall pay percentage, on admission thereto same as at main entrance. Any show offering articles for sale shall confine its selling activities within its tents or other enclosure.
- 7. All concession stands are to be kept clean and neat at all times.
- 8. All refreshment and eat stands must comply with all state regulations relative to serving food and drink.
- 9. Refuse from each stand must be placed in container.
- Persons working at concession stands are to be neat, clean and courteous at all times.
- No person shall have in his possession or bring into the Itasca County Fairgrounds any intoxicating liquor.
- 12. No person shall consume or have possession of any alcoholic beverage except at the properly licensed stand authorized by the Itasca County Fair Board.

RULES OF ENTRY

- The books of entry of the Annual Fair shall be in charge of the Secretary of the Association and shall be open to the residents of the State of Minnesota.
- Exhibitor Handbook and Entries are on-line. Follow on-line instructions. Visit www.itascacountyfair.org for information under the Fair tab. ALL ENTRIES CLOSE July 31st AT 11:45pm
- Entries shall be liable to special conditions imposed by the Board of Directors, such as fees, prizes, time named to be on the grounds. Exhibitors violating such rules may be barred from receiving any benefits by an order from the board.
- For Sale signs on any livestock exhibit will not be allowed.
- Entries for premiums in the individual lots of grain, field seeds, fruits and forage cannot appear as parts of collections.
- 6. Grain, vegetables, fruit, dairy products and domestic manufacturers must have been raised or made by the exhibitors thereof during the past year.
- 7. The selling or giving of milk from dairy cattle or goats is strictly prohibited .

EXHIBITS

- Every article or animal must correspond in number and description with the premium list, and be in its proper lot classification to quality for premiums. Advanced registration required no later than July 31st at 11:45 p.m.
- 2. No article or animal will be assigned a place on the grounds until entry has been made.
- 3. No collections shall be allowed space which is not neatly arranged and fully labeled. A duplication of varieties in any collection shall debar the collection from prize money.
- 4. All articles and animals entered are to remain on exhibit until 4:00pm on the last day of the fair
- 5. The Itasca County Fair Board reserves the right at any time to refuse entries or prohibit the exhibition or animals or articles entered.

NOTE -The Itasca County Agricultural Association will take every precaution in its power for the reservation of articles and stock on exhibition, but cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition, or removal thereof.

DEPARTMENT 1 - HORSES

Exhibitors must abide by Superintendent's Judgment and rules set down by the Fair Board.

NEGATIVE COGGINS TEST REQUIRED. MUST PROVIDE PRINTED CERTIFICATE TO VET AT

CHECK IN. ADVANCED ENTRIES REQUIRED THROUGH Fairentry.com

Advanced entry deadline is July 31st at 11:45 pm

Stall reservation requests from ALL exhibitors can be sent to ICAA attention Wendy at P.O. Box 673 Grand Rapids, MN 55744, any time after June 30th. Stalls will be assigned based on postmark. Groups of 6 stalls or more must be postmarked by July 15th to received priority placement.

All horses being stalled must be in stalls by 8:00 pm Thursday and kept stabled until 4:00pm Sunday, the last day of the fair. Vet authorization required for early removal.

All exhibitors whose horse has been issued a stall must enter and exhibit at least one class on Friday or Saturday.

Riding is permitted only in the arena and exercise areas, and only by exhibitors. A proper Dress Code is required. BOOTS (with a heel) ARE REQUIRED IN THE SHOW RING AND EXERCISE RING. NO EXCEPTIONS!!

(No open toed shoes or bare feet will be allowed at anytime!)

NO HORSES IN THE RIDING ARENA AFTER LIGHTS OUT.

Racing and reckless riding will not be tolerated at any time.

ABSOLUTELY NO SMOKING IN THE LIVESTOCK BARNS.

Major stall cleaning must be completed by 10:00am. Barns close at 11:00pm each night. All horse exhibitors must keep their stalls and alleys clean at all times. Chairs may be in the alleyway only when in use.

Gaming warm-ups permitted only in designated area at the posted times. In a class where a change of equipment is required, a time of fifteen (15) minutes will be allowed.

Weanlings, Yearlings and Stallions may be brought in on the day of show and taken home after showing.

ELIGIBLE CLASSES ARE TO BE CONSIDERED QUALIFYING CLASSES FOR THE W.S.C.A. CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW.

All exhibitors are to be attired in suitable Western, English, or Dress Attire.

Exhibitors will be allowed to show horses according to their breed specifications.

Stallions must be exhibited with a Stallion Bridle (chain under jaw), or a halter with chain. Exhibitor must be 18 or older to show a stallion 1 year or older.

All livestock trailers that are left during the Fair will be parked in the West lot by attendant.

Camping trailers and motor homes may not be left on the Fairgrounds before WEDNESDAY of the Fair week without prior authorization. They will be parked by attendant and charged \$15.00 or \$25.00 with electric, per day. Violators' vehicles will be towed at owner's expense.

The Fair Board will not be liable for any livestock on the grounds.

Rules will be strictly enforced by members of the Fair Board.

Ribbons to six (6) places. Premiums to four (4) places.

VET CHECK REQUIREMENTS:

ALL HORSES ARE REQUIRED TO BE VET-CHECKED. THERE IS NO VET FEE. EXHIBITORS MUST PRESENT A PAPER COPY OF A NEGATIVE COGGINS CERTIFICATE FOR EACH HORSE.

STALLED HORSES: MAY BE UNLOADED BUT MUST REMAIN AT THE TRAILER UNTIL CHECKED.

TRALERED IN HORSES: MAY BE UNLOADED BUT MUST REMAIN AT THE TRAILER UNTIL CHECKED. HORSES ARE TO BE VET-CHECKED EACH DAY THEY ARE ON THE GROUNDS.

Board of Animal Health Livestock Health Requirements for Public Exhibition (see general requirements)

CATTLE (originating from Minnesota)

Fair veterinarian will examine cattle before they are unloaded from trailer.

Cattle must be free of infectious diseases and ringworm and warts.

CATTLE (not originating from Minnesota)

Animals must meet the Minnesota Importation requirements in addition to the requirements outlined in this summary. Health certificates must list the Minnesota Exhibition as consignee and will be accepted if examination and tests are conducted within 90 days prior to the exhibition except swine pseudorabies tests which must be made within 30 days.

CATTLE RULES:

- 1. Assignment of stalls and pens will be made by the Superintendent.
- 2. Any late arrivals or early cuts must be declared by the Superintendent.

In case of early outs, premiums money will be forfeited if exhibitors leave early.

- 3. Any breed not having entries two years in succession will not have classes listed in the entry book. They will be allowed to show in any other breeds in later years.
- 4. Any animals deemed unmanageable and possible threat to the safety of other exhibitors and the public will not be allowed to remain at the exhibit.
- 5. All bulls over one year of age must be neck-tied by a suitable chain while in the barn.
- 6. All bulls over one year of age must be handled by a nose restraint while outside of the stall area.
- 7. All cattle must be checked by the vet on day of entry.
- 8. 4-H animals will be allowed to and are encouraged to be entered into open class divisions regardless of how they placed in the 4-H division. Entries of 4-H animals into open classes must be made in advance (deadline July 31st)



Rabbits may arrive Wednesday 6-9 pm and Thursday from 8am until 6pm. Rabbits will remain in place until 5:00pm Sunday, but must be out of the barn by 7:30 Sunday evening.

The Fair Board will not be responsible for the animals left after this time. The barn will be locked and no one will be in attendance.

Exhibitors must provide the feed for their rabbits, as well as provide for their care and cleaning. Exhibitors are responsible for showing their own rabbits. Pens will be provided by the Agricultural Association. Entries shall be made by exhibitor only and exhibitor shall not have more than one entry in any one lot. A limit of 50 rabbits per family can be shown.

No animal showing signs of disease may be entered. Rabbits will be inspected by competent persons before being admitted to the barn. The Fair Veterinarian will make the final decision.

The Rules and Standards of the ARBA will govern the Entries and Judging.

ALL RABBITS MUST MEET THE AMERICAN RABBIT BREEDERS ASSOCIATION STANDARD WEIGHTS FOR THE BREED.

- Senior rabbits shall be defined as over eight months of age for large breeds, and over six months of age for all other breeds.
- Junior rabbits shall be defined as under six months of age for all breeds not over standard age weights.
- Intermediate or 6-8 rabbits shall be defined as over six months and under eight months of age for breeds with this class.

Commercial meat-pen entry (only Recognized breeds competing) shall consist of three fryer rabbits, not less than 42 days and not over 10 weeks of age, not less than $3^{1}/_{2}$ pounds and not over $5^{1}/_{2}$ pounds individual weight. All must be of the same breed and variety and meet the standard of the breed.

All rabbits brought to the barn must be entered in competition in regular lots as given below.

All rabbits must have permanent and legible identification mark in left ear.

Base date for computing age shall be first day of the fair. Rabbits entered in Class 1 "Pet Rabbit" cannot enter any other class. Rosettes will be awarded for the Best of Breed and Best Opposite of Breed for each breed and for the Meat Pen.

SNAP BEANS: Harvest before constrictions appear between seeds, when seeds are about half grown. Ends of pods should not be broken off in picking. Pods should be uniform. Pods may be wiped clean, but not washed. Leave stems attached.

BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, TURNUPS, RUTABAGAS: Root crops should be mature but not over grown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops trimmed off 1 –1/2 inches above crown. Side roots trimmed off but not the tap root. Roots carefully washed but not scrubbed. Do not clean by brushing as done in the past.

BROCCOLI: Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5 inches from top of head.

CABBAGE: Stems cut about 1/2 inch below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves but care should be taken not to peel the heads too much. A few outside wrapper leaves are desirable. Specimens may be washed.

CAULIFLOWER: Heads should be white, compact, and free of small leaves and ricy texture. Stems cut so as to leave 4 to 6 leaves. Outer leaves trimmed to 1—2 inches about the white head. Use soft bristled brush to remove dirt from heads.

CELERY: Remove roots of stalk and trim back to form a triangle or pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on outside until color is uniform.

SWEET CORN: Select ears that are well filled out to the tip. Kernels should be milky and juicy. Remove outer husks but allow a short shank and the inner husks to remain.

CUCUMBERS: Pickling: select fruits 3-5 inches long. Specimens should be the same stage of maturity and uniform in size, shape, and color. Slicers: select fruits that are straight, dark green, and 6-10 inches long. They should be uniform in size, shape and color. Leave stems attached.

KOHLRABI: Remove roots just below the ball. Remove all but the upper 4-6 leaves. Select specimens that are uniform, medium size, and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumbnail. They should be cleaned, but not washed.

STORAGE ONIONS: Have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give slick appearance. Only such outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length of 1/2 inch. Wipe or brush but do not wash. Cut top 1 inch to 1-1/2 inches long.

BUNCHING ONIONS: Specimens should be peeled, 6-8 inches, tops trimmed, roots trimmed to 1/4 inch.

POTATOES: Tubers should be uniform in size, color and shape. Washing is permitted but do not blemish the skin by scrubbing. Avoid specimens with defects or disease.

RHUBARD: Select specimens that are straight, uniform and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Trim the leaf blade to about one inch above the stalk.

SUMMER SQUASH: Select small to medium size fruits when the rind is soft and easily punctured with thumbnail. Select specimens that are uniform in size, shape, and color. Leave about 1/2 inch of stem and wipe fruits clean.

WINTER SQUASH and PUMPKINS: Select mature specimens where the rind resists the pressure of the thumbnail. Fruits should be free of defects, uniform in size, shape, and color. Leave steam attached to the fruit.

SWISS CHARD: Select plants that are fresh, crisp and have bright green leaves. Trim off roots and trim bulbs to pyramid shape. Trim off diseased and broken leaves on the outside until the color is uniform.

TOMATOES: Select fruits that are uniform in size, shape, and color. Fruits should be perfectly shaped and free of cracks or blemishes.


